As we approach the joyous season of Christmas, I am reminded of the beautiful traditions that connect us across cultures and time. One such tradition is Yalda Night, celebrated in Persian culture and rooted in the ancient practices of Mithraism.

Yalda Night, observed on December 21st, marks the winter solstice, the longest night of the year.

It symbolizes the triumph of light over darkness and the renewal of the sun. In ancient Persia, this night was associated with the birth of Mithra, the god of light and truth. Families and friends gather to share food, read poetry, and light candles, celebrating the victory of light and the promise of a new dawn.

Similarly, Christmas, celebrated on December 25th, commemorates the birth of Jesus Christ, the Light of the World. This season is a time of joy, hope, and renewal. We gather with loved ones, exchange gifts, and light candles, celebrating the arrival of Christ and the light He brings into our lives.



Both Yalda Night and Christmas share the themes of light overcoming darkness, renewal, and hope. They remind us of the universal human desire to find light and hope during the darkest times of the year. These celebrations emphasize the importance of family, community, and the shared joy of coming together.

In Zoroastrianism, another ancient Persian tradition, the humble rooster stands as a vigilant sentinel of light, an unwavering champion in the eternal clash between order and chaos. When its crow pierces the silence of dawn, it's far more than a simple heralding of morning—it's an ancient rallying cry, a call for the forces of Asha (righteousness) to rise and reclaim the world from Druj (deceit and disorder). With each sunrise, the rooster's voice echoes like a battle horn, marking yet another victory of light over shadow. The Gathas, Zarathustra's sacred verses, capture this spiritual harmony: "By the dawn's fire, the world sheds falsehood." In its crow, the rooster channels the voice of Sraosha, the divine guardian of truth, rousing all life to the promise that no darkness, however pervasive, can outlast the relentless march of the sun.

As we celebrate Christmas this year, let us also reflect on the ancient traditions of Yalda Night. Let us give thanks for the light and hope in our lives, for the fellowship we share, and for the ongoing journey towards reconciliation, peace, and restorative justice.

A CHANGE AT CAPITAL AREA COUNCIL OF CHURCHES

November 1 was a significant date for our Capital Area Council of Churches (CACC). Longtime Executive Director Bruce France retired after serving five years in that position. Selected to replace him was the current Council President Peter Crasto-Donnelly. Peter has been a member of the CACC Board for five years, the last two serving as its President. Peter has been employed, for six years, at the Food Pantries for the Capital District. His latest role there has been as the Program Director.

November brought a second very important change at the Council. A "move". First Lutheran Church in Albany has been "home" to the Council for a number of years. The Council has now moved to First Church in Albany. First Church is located

A big Thank You to First Lutheran. They have provided the Council space for a number of years for the Council Office, the Shelter, and when needed, space for larger Council events, including ecumenical/ interfaith worship programs.

Looking ahead at the Council, two major events are on the January calendar. January 12 the Council will have the Ecumenical Witness of Baptism Renewal Service. And on January 15, the Martin Luther King, Jr. Interfaith Celebration. Watch for more details for both programs.
