

FAMILY ASSISTANCE MINISTRY (FAM)

"I got sick and had to go on unemployment. It's not enough to pay the heat and phone bills. The medical bills piled up and then my wife lost her job. We don't know where to turn." "They tell me that I am part of the sandwich generation, I take care of the kids and my family. My Mom and Dad are in their 80's and need more

help than I can provide. I'm not sure what to do."



These are just 2 stories similar to those of church families who participated in the FAM. Every Sunday, we sit in pews with people struggling to meet unasked for family crises. In 2014, when a family from Pakistan needed help, we started the Family Assistance Ministry (FAM) to assist with finding a place to live, with the rent, with medicine, food and the red tape of seeking asylum and safety from persecution in their homeland.

Over the past 11 years, FAM has assisted 13 families, 43 people, with; long term financial help, information and referral to community service in addition to emotional

and spiritual support. These resources are provided in confidence so families can weather crises and stabilize to meet life's challenges.

Recently, FAM has expanded assistance to families to include transportation, dinners to families when needed, consultants knowledgeable in community services, and financial help when all community programs have been accessed and there are still unmet critical needs.

WE NEED YOUR HELP

The church budget provides some funds but the majority comes from your donations, from the Church Christmas Card donations and from fundraising at Coffee Houses and other church events. Food Crisis Needs Your Help

Qholaqhoe Mountain Connections (QMC), is a nonprofit organization that works with a population of villagers



in a remote mountain region of Lesotho, southern Africa. It has provided financial grants to fund education, cultivate sustainable farming practices, and alleviate hunger among a population of orphans. Our church has been supporting QMC for approximately 15 years, and

we have developed a close relationship with Lynn Minderman, the founder of QMC.

Lynn is a former Peace Corps volunteer and educator who fell in love with the people of Lesotho and returned to the country determined to help. QMC has been a labor of love. Thanks to Lynn, we have been kept informed about the challenges and successes of the Program. Recently, Lynn has made us aware of a dire food shortage that is affecting the population. Lesotho's Prime Minister, Sam Matekane, has declared a national state of food insecurity disaster. This comes in response to the severe El Niño-induced drought affecting the country and the broader Southern Africa region. The government reports that up to 700,000 people, nearly one-third of the population, are now facing severe food insecurity.

Our Missions Team is asking for your support to assist in this food shortage. Your kind donation will help families survive this current crisis. If you would like to lend a hand, donations may be made with a check made out to the church.
