Cumulatively, between them, George and Cynthia represent our Church's history with 181 years of attending the Church. Cynthia's parents and grandparents helped found the church and combined with other key families...the Lemka's, Hennegers, Beckers,.....supported the church through easy and difficult years.




Cynthia's stories of her early years in Sunday school in the hallways at the former Appleland church home, now Doggie Day Care, and the changes in the Methodist Church home from earlier church homes to our current building were informative and charming. Her recollection of earlier programs like the Mother Daughter Banquets, the women of the church refusing to have a large kitchen built in our current facility in order to remove the responsibility of cooking Church Dinners reminded us of life in different times than now. Her stories of Aunt Mable Henninger and the midnight thief and others charmed and intrigued us.

George's knowledge of the church is encyclopedic. He regaled us with

mountain climbing stories with Rev. Stan Moore, of youth group experiences, of his work with confirmation classes, taking them to NYC and Philadelphia and more. He challenges us to be passionate about who we are and what we can offer others.

Both George and Cynthia were babies born into the church, baptized, confirmed and growing up in the church. Both saw the church as an internal part of their lives, a safe wonderful place of activities, friends, music, worship and acceptance...a place to give to others and be given to. Their advice to us is to always grow and change...transformation is a constant in all our lives and being inflexible leads to the demise of a church.

Approximately 45 people, new and long time members, attended this informative, fun and illuminating hour long session seeing the early church through Cynthia and George stories and memories.
