Appointment Announcement

We are so very thankful for the pastoral leadership that Rev. Jeff Matthews brings to us this summer and early fall. His leadership is both a comfort and an inspiration!

It is my joy to share with you today that Bishop Héctor A. Burgos-Núñez has appointed a team of interim pastors to lead us through the remainder of this appointment year. Rev. Mary Beth Blinn will be the lead interim pastor, serving half-time, and Rev. Jennifer Williamson will also be appointed to this team, serving quarter-time. Reverends Blinn and Williamson will begin their new responsibilities this fall, and will continue through June of 2026.

Some of you had the opportunity to meet Rev. Mary Beth Blinn when she preached here last month, but to introduce her again to some of you, and for the first time to those who were not with us that Sunday, here is a brief bio. Rev. Blinn is an ordained elder and member of the Virginia Annual Conference. She retired in 2019, after 38 years of ministry in Virginia and in the Red Bird Missionary Conference, and she also served as a District Superintendent. Albany became her home in 2021. Her daughter, Anna Blinn Cole, is the pastor at Cobleskill UMC, and her son, Christopher Blinn, is a Special Education Teacher near Philadelphia. She has three grandchildren: Charles, June, and Calder.

Rev. Jennifer Williamson is a lifelong United Methodist and has been ordained since 2006. She has served as an Associate Pastor at a large suburban church, head pastor at a mid-sized small town church and pastor of youth ministries and visitation at an urban church. She currently serves as a chaplain with St. Peter's Health. She has served in churches in East Ohio, West Ohio and Colorado. She values relationship building and places a high value on pastoral care. She is very involved in the Episcopal Diocese of Albany where her husband is the Bishop and has preached at and visited several Episcopal churches in the Northeastern part of New York, as well as in some of our area United Methodist Churches.

The CROP Hunger Walk enables Church World Service (CWS) to provide just and sustainable responses



to hunger, poverty, displacement and disaster. Last year, CWS provided hygiene and school kits, cleanup buckets and blankets to those impacted by flooding in California; child safe-guarding services in Latin America; training on sustainable vegetable farming and good nutritional practices in Africa; and flood-resistant household latrines, wells or water filtration systems in Asia.

Please plan to join the Castleton CROP Hunger Walk on Sunday, October 19th. Onequarter of all funds will be directed to the Anchor Food

Pantry. Three-quarters of the funds support the work of CWS and its partners. Walkers may register at www.crophungerwalk.org/castletonny. 
Storytelling Night, September 3, 7:00 pm

Our church voted to become a Reconciling Congregation in 2011, fourteen years ago. Our Kairos Prison Ministry serves those incarcerated in Green and Coxsackie Prisons. Volunteers bring compassion, fellowship and a breath of fresh air to those behind bars. We recall the words of Jesus: I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me. Matthew 25:36
