ELECTRICITY GENERATION – TODAY AND TOMORROW

Please join us in the Choir Room on Sunday January 25 at 11:00 am as Joe Visalli offers a presentation and question and answer period on electrical grid reliability, an important consideration as we face the challenge of growing electricity demand (e.g., data centers) and replacement of fossil fuel with renewable energy sources. According to the [US Energy Information Administration](#), in 2023, natural gas-fired power plants provided 46% of New York State's electricity net generation and renewable sources (hydropower, nuclear power, solar, wind and biomass) the remaining 54%. The New York Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (CLCPA) mandates that 70% of the state's electricity must come from renewable sources by 2030. The 16% increase in renewable energy presents a significant challenge for renewable energy growth.



Before retirement, Joe Visalli was the Research and Development Director for Energy Resources, Transportation and Environmental Programs at the NYS Energy and Research Development Authority (NYSERDA). This responsibility covered renewable as well as fossil fuel technologies, batteries, electric vehicles and water/wastewater/solid waste technologies plus environmental programs in the Adirondacks. His presentation will cover the inherent physical characteristics and limitations of renewable and fossil fueled electricity generation and how these impact grid reliability. It includes concepts of comparative capacity factors and efficiencies, effects of high ambient temperatures and requirements for restarting electricity generation.

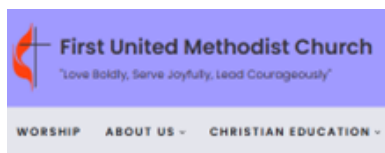
